



Qualifier – 41st United States Mid-Amateur

General Information:

The Rules of Golf as adopted by the United States Golf Association govern play. This information sheet, the USGA Hard Card and any site-specific Local Rules and Conditions of Competition sheets are supplements to the Rules of Golf. Local Rules of the host course do not apply.

Schedule of Events & Format:

Thursday, August 4th – Qualifying (18 Holes of stroke play)

Grouping & Starting Times:

Starting times begin at 7:30am.

Qualifying Positions:

The players with the three (3) lowest 18-hole total will advance to the 41st United States Mid-Amateur Championship. There will also be two (2) alternate positions available. Should you qualify, you must accept your position and pick up the proper credentials prior to leaving the qualifying site.

Play-Off:

In the event of any tie for the last qualifying place or any of the alternate positions, the players concerned shall compete in a sudden death play-off to begin immediately following the conclusion of the round.

Registration:

When you arrive at the club, please check in at the reception table located in front of the golf shop.

Practice Round:

Keney Park Golf Club is a public facility. Practice rounds are available at their published rates and times.

Practice Range:

The practice range will be open beginning at 6:30am. Range balls are compliments of the CSGA.

Course Setup:

Keney Park Golf Course will play as a par 70 at approximately 6,400 yards with a time par of 4 hours and 26 minutes.

Caddies:

The use of a caddie is permitted. Keney Park does not have any club caddies available.

Automotive Transportation:

The use of a golf cart during the round is prohibited.

Pull Carts:

The use of a push/pull cart is permitted.

Driver Heads:

Model Local Rule G-1 is in effect. Any driver the player uses to make a stroke must have a clubhead, identified by model and loft, which is on the current List of Conforming Driver Heads issued by the USGA.

Groove & Punch Mark Specifications:

Model Local Rule G-2 is in effect. In making a stroke, the player must use clubs that conform to the groove and punch mark specifications in the Equipment Rules that took effect on January 1, 2010.

Golf Balls:

Model Local Rule G-3 is in effect. Any ball used in making a stroke must be on the current List of Conforming Golf Ball issued by the USGA.

One Ball Rule:-

Model Local Rule G-4 is in effect. During an entire round, each ball at which the player makes a stroke must be the same brand and model as found in a single entry on the current List of Conforming Golf Balls.

Pace of Play:

The pace of play policy as adopted by the Connecticut State Golf Association will be in effect.

Attire:

Proper golf attire is required at all times by players, caddies and spectators. Shorts must be Bermuda length. Shirts must have a collar and be tucked in. Jeans of all kinds, cargo pants/shorts, tee shirts and tank tops are prohibited. Hats must be worn in a traditional manner.

Footwear:

Shoes with traditionally-designed spikes (regardless of composition, i.e., ceramic, plastic, etc.) or spikes, regardless of design, comprised either entirely or partially of metal (if such metal may come in contact with the course) are prohibited during the stipulated round. Penalty for breach of this condition is disqualification.

Withdrawals:

You must contact the USGA Championship Department at (908) 234-2300 or the CSGA at (860) 257-4171 if you must withdraw from this qualifier. A competitor who fails to notify either the USGA or CSGA of his withdrawal may be subject to disciplinary actions by the USGA.
